



October Programs at the Library Feature Virtual Star Wars, a Book Club and Car Parade

A variety of programs are available via Zoom for every age group during the month of October, including Virtual Padawan Training for Star Wars fans aged 5-10 on **Saturday, Oct. 17, at 10 a.m.** Presented by The Saber Guild, a not-for-profit, LucasFilm-recognized Star Wars costuming group that specializes in choreographed lightsaber shows, the program will teach the basics of using the Force and how to wield a lightsaber.

For adults, we have a new program, the Best Lives Book Club, which focuses on how we

achieve happiness, and success, and how we find our unique purpose in life. Join us **Monday, Oct. 19, at 7 p.m.** for a discussion of *Self-Compassion*, by Dr. Kristen Neff. This program is also being presented at Mark Twain Library in Redding.
