- The numbers for Covid have ticked up some so Easton is at a rate of 9.5 per 100,000 for the weeks ending Nov. 13. This does not mean any changes, but it is a reminder that the pandemic isn't over yet.
- There will be a public forum on Nov. 23 at 7:30 p.m. at Samuel Staples Elementary School, to discuss public act 21-29 and affordable housing in town. State Senator Tony Hwang, State Rep. Anne Hughes and P&Z Chair Ray Martin will speak. This is informational only and will be recorded. The town is required to produce a plan by June 30, 2022. In formulating that plan there will be multiple opportunities for public input. The public forum is to provide information from local legislators on the act itself.
- The Senior Center has been working overtime to collect and deliver food to neighbors in need.
